

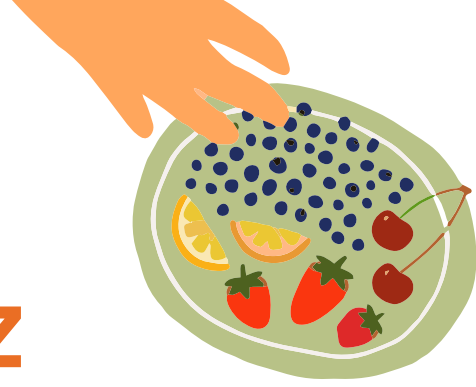

1. Queso is the Spanish word for what food?
Answer: b) Cheese
2. Which South American country was named after an explorer?
Answer: Colombia (named after Christopher Columbus)
3. In Malay and Indonesian cuisine, what is “nasi”?
Answer: Rice
4. Which country’s name means “Land of the Aryans”?
Answer: Iran – the word Iran literally translates to “Land of Aryans” in the Persian language. What are the three national floral and faunal emblems of Australia?
5. What are the three national floral and faunal emblems of Australia?
Answer: Kangaroo, emu & golden wattle (you need all three for a point!)
6. In 2013, what country was last to join the European Union?
Answer: a) Croatia joined in July 2013.
7. Mariculture is the cultivation of what food source?
Answer: Fish (or other marine life)
8. What is Australia’s oldest chocolate bar?
Answer: Cherry ripe! According to Roy Morgan research, not only is it the oldest (dating back to 1924), it’s also the country’s favourite.
9. Eid al-Fitr marks the end of what religious festival?
Answer: Ramadan – to mark the end of Ramadan (holy month of fasting), there is a three day celebration called Eid al-Fitr bringing families and friends together for prayer, picnics, feasts and fun.
10. In which Australian state or territory can you find the Tarkine?
Answer: Tasmania – the Tarkine is a spectacular area containing the Savage River National Park in the north west of Tasmania.
11. By area, what is the largest landlocked country found wholly in Europe?
Answer: b) Hungary. Both countries are larger than Hungary, however Kazakhstan is located mainly in Asia and partly in Eastern Europe, and Belarus is bordered by Russia.

Answer: Pamplona
