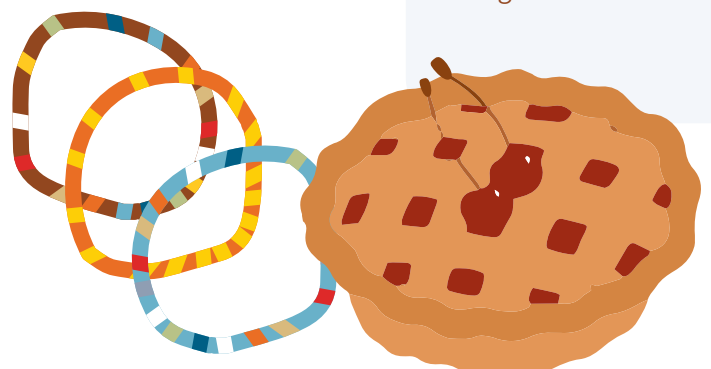
9. Cultural Discovery Bingo:
